What?

The monthly House competition that enables students to win a selected fiction book by answering a simple question.

Why?

To ensure the continued promotion of literacy and offer a variety of ways for our students to respond to and get involved in the strong reading culture of the school.

Who?

The Books of the Month competition is open to all students, with two different books being selected – one for Primary Phase and one for Secondary Phase. A winner will be chosen at random from each Phase. During lockdown, the prize will be posted out to the winners. Should the winners be in school, their prize will be delivered to them in the classroom.

When?

Students can submit their answers until Wednesday 3 March. Winners will be announced by the end of that week, on Friday 7 March and will be notified via social media, the school website and email.

How?

- Students must correctly answer the question below, from the choices given. The question is also posted on social media and the school website. You can submit your response via Twitter and Instagram using the hashtag #whgsbooksofthefmonth, tagging @whgslibrary, or send it to Miss Daly via email. You can also send answers to your class teacher (for Primary Phase) or form tutor (for Secondary Phase) and they will be forwarded on to the LRC.
- A winner for each Phase will be chosen at random, from all correct entries. Prizes will be posted out or delivered to students in school after the closing date.
- The Primary Phase title is **Icarus Was Ridiculous** by Pamela Butchart and the Secondary Phase title is **A Darkness of Dragons** by S. A. Patrick.
