

Year 12

Unit 1 Britain Transformed, 1918-97

Content:

- Key political and economic changes; the development of work and industry
- Creation of the Welfare State and the NHS; development of education
- Key social changes, including class relations; women's rights; the "liberal society" of the 1960's; immigration and race relations

■ Changing quality of life, the impact of war; growth of consumerism; leisure and travel; popular culture, including cinema, radio, television and youth culture.

Unit 4 Coursework

Content:

The purpose of this unit is to develop analysis and evaluation skills of interpretations of History. You will set your own research question and develop your skills to produce a critical review based on a controversy in History.

A-Level Assessment

Assessment is based on 3 exams at the end of 2 years. Plus a piece of coursework produced in Year 13. Unit 1 worth 30% of your A level, Unit 2 worth 20%, Unit 3 worth 30% and Unit 4 worth 20%.

Beyond A-Levels: Future Career Aspirations

If you want to study History in further education this is an excellent base. History is also seen as a traditionally strong qualification, which teaches you important transferrable skills, such as research skills, independent study skills and critical thinking. History A level is a desirable qualification if you are thinking of studying law or journalism or teaching.
