## Year 12



Overview

In Sociology we offer a diverse and inclusive curriculum in which students can explore how society runs and functions. Students learn more about the social cause and consequence of human behaviour and will learn specifically about the key theoretical underpinnings within Sociology, the education system and culture and identity. Students will gain knowledge of a range of Sociological concepts and enhance their knowledge through discussion and debate.
