Welcome back. We hope you had a lovely break.






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Reception

We hope you had a wonderful break and are ready for an exciting new half term.

Our theme will be castles, knights, and dragons, and we have lots of engaging activities planned.

**Literacy**

Our Talk for Writing text will be *George and the Dragon*. Through this story, children will begin to describe dragons using simple captions and sentences. Daily phonics lessons will continue, focusing on building speed and confidence in word reading and writing using special friends.

Mathematics

We will deepen our understanding of number sense with numbers 6 to 8. Children will also explore mass and capacity through hands-on activities and experiments.

Understanding the World

As part of our castles theme, we will learn about royal families from around the world and famous figures from the past. We will also celebrate Chinese New Year, learning about traditions and customs. Children will have the exciting opportunity to meet visitors who will teach us how to perform a traditional Chinese Dragon Dance.

Physical Development (PE)

Our PE focus will be **dance**, helping children develop balance, strength, and coordination.

Our Rights Journey

We are beginning our journey to learn about our rights through the **Rights Respecting Schools Award**. We will start with **Article 3**, which means that adults should always do what is best for children. We will explore this idea through the story *Owl Babies*, thinking about how the owlets are cared for and what it means to feel safe and looked after.



Year 1

Welcome back, we hope you have had a lovely break. We cannot wait to see what the Spring term has in store for us!

Phonics will be a **HUGE** priority in the Spring term as Year 1 prepare for their phonics screening check at the beginning of June. Please continue to read daily at home and practise speed sounds with your child. In our writing lessons, Year 1 will be exploring Pie Corbett's 'The Magic Pot'. We will be writing a story about magic and disaster, and an explanation text on how to make a magic item!



In our maths lessons, we will be consolidating our understanding of numbers to 20. Please help support your child at home by touch counting items you have around your home. We are still learning to form all our numbers correctly so practice this at home! If you would like to challenge your child, please encourage them to write their number as a word. We will then move on to adding and subtracting numbers between 1-20.

In our science lessons, we will be exploring the four different seasons and how the weather changes across them. We are visiting Alexandra Park to explore wildlife changes over the season of Spring. This half term we will be studying geography. Our unit will be, 'Where we are.' In this unit, Year 1 will learn about their home, school and community on a local scale, and then how that fits into the UK on a national scale. We will be learning how the UK is made up of four countries and we will explore urban, rural and coastal areas.

Happy New Year! Welcome back to a new term at WHGS. We hope you had a lovely holiday and are raring to go for another busy term ahead. We were so proud of how your children performed in the Nativity at the end of last term, and we know that they will continue to impress us with their fantastic learning this half term.

Reading remains a huge priority for us in Year 2. We are working hard towards all children completing the Phonics programme and there will be a greater focus on reading comprehension skills. Please ensure your children are reading at home every day as this is a vital skill that only develops with regular practice.

In English, we will be writing a narrative based on the Magic Paintbrush and a letter based on The Day The Crayons Quit. Could you write a letter to someone you know to tell them what you have been doing at school? These lessons will be supplemented with lots of extra reading materials linked to the theme.

In Maths, we will be starting with multiplication and division so please continue practising counting in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science, we will be learning about the properties of everyday materials, which links to our work in D.T. where we will be creating a model fire engine. In R.E. the focus is on Judaism and children will be encouraged to make links and comparisons with other religion and worldviews. In Geography, we are going to be learning about hot and cold deserts and in computing we are going to be making pictograms online.

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Year 3

Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely break and that the children are ready for a new term of learning.

In English, children will be writing suspense stories and learning how to make the reader feel excited. Later in the term, they will be writing instructions. At home, you can help by talking about exciting stories or films, encouraging your child to tell you a story using words like *suddenly* or *carefully*, or helping them write instructions for something they do at home, such as making a sandwich, getting ready for school, playing a game, or creating something.

In maths, we will continue with multiplication and division before moving on to shape and measuring. Practising times tables on Times Table Rockstars, counting objects at home, and measuring items like books or tables will really support your child's learning.

We will continue with reading a range of stories in class, including visits to the library. We are also encouraging children to share their thoughts about books and recommend books to each other. Reading together at home, even for a short time, and talking about what happened in the story or what they liked will help build confidence and enjoyment.

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Year 4

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all enjoyed a wonderful break and are feeling refreshed and ready for an amazing year ahead! We are thrilled to welcome everyone back and can't wait to dive into all the exciting learning opportunities 2026 has in store.

This term, we'll begin with the inspiring story ***The Great Kapok Tree***, which will spark ideas for writing our own stories with a moral. Children will focus on key Year 4 writing skills, such as using inverted commas accurately for speech and adding detail with prepositional phrases. Why not try writing a short story with a moral at home? It's a great way to reinforce these skills! We'll also continue to develop handwriting and practise Year 3 and 4 spelling words.

In maths, our learning journey continues with multiplication and division, moving on to multiplying and dividing by two-digit and even three-digit numbers. A big focus this year is times tables mastery—by the end of Year 4, children should know all tables up to 12×12 . We'll practise weekly in school, and we encourage you to keep practising at home using Times Tables Rockstars or quick verbal recall. Your progress so far has been fantastic—keep it up!

Across the wider curriculum, we have some truly fascinating adventures ahead! In science, we'll become particle detectives as we explore the states of matter and discover how solids, liquids, and gases behave. In geography, we'll journey deep into the tropical rainforests, learning about their incredible biodiversity and why they are so vital to our planet. In DT, we'll put our creativity to the test by designing and building a video set, which we'll use to record an important message about protecting the Amazon rainforest. In PSHE, we'll focus on building strong, positive relationships and staying safe online—skills that are essential for life in our digital world. Throughout all these lessons, we'll be linking back to the **UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)**, helping every child understand their rights and responsibilities as global citizens.

You can bring this learning to life at home by encouraging your child to research amazing rainforest animals or create a mini poster about why rainforests matter. They might even enjoy making a short video or presentation to share their ideas with the class!

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
Year 5

We would like to welcome all of Year 5 back after an extremely successful Autumn term and a well-deserved break! In the first three weeks we will be swimming every day. Like us, I am sure you are very excited about this so please make sure you remember your swimming kits every day.

First in writing, we will be diving into the world of Japanese poems called Tankas. We are looking forward to seeing all your creativity shine during this unit. We will then write a spooky and gripping story based on Crater Lake. At home you could try writing your own spooky story. How will you create suspense and create a picture in the reader's mind?

In maths, we will be ensuring that children in Year 5 are able to use and evaluate different methods of multiplication and division. We will then build on our knowledge of fractions from last term to explore them in greater depth.

As geographers, children in Year 5 will be investigating the water cycle and then conducting an in-depth study of the North American continent. In our weekly RE lessons, we will be considering the question: "If God is everywhere, why go to a place of worship?" We will be examining this thought-provoking question from a wide-range of different religious traditions including Christianity, Islam, Judaism and Hinduism. We will be learning about life-cycles in Science and comparing the similarities and differences between mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds and fish.

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Year 6

What a successful term we had last year! I am sure that you are just as proud of your children as we are - Year 6 have been working incredibly hard.

Based upon our Autumn term whole class read of *Holes*, Year 6 will be writing a complaint letter which incorporates not only their knowledge of the book but also their knowledge of the UNICEF Rights Charter.

In Maths, pupils will learn about decimal numbers before continuing onto understanding percentages. Using their knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages they will make comparisons between all three.

During our weekly R.E. lessons, children will explore various world religions to answer our one big question: "What difference does it make to believe in Ahimsa (harmlessness), Grace (the generosity of God), and Ummah (community)?"

Year 6 will be geographers this half-term as they learn about migration around the world. We will be learning about the different types of migration and why it occurs across the world.

Over the next few weeks, Year 6 will be investigating Light during their Science learning. They will be delving into new knowledge on shadows, reflections and colour vision. This will be supported by a school trip to the Museum of Science and Industry in Manchester.

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
