Autumn Term

Students begin Year 11 with Paper 2 Section A - Superpower Relations and the Cold War. Students explore the ongoing political rivalry between the United States and the Soviet Union and their respective allies that developed after World War II, whilst continuing to develop their extended writing skills. Paper 3, an evidence-based paper which assesses a student's ability to use sources and interpretations to make judgements about the past. Again, building on prior knowledge from KS3, students understand the causes and impact of one of the most important events of the 20th century, the Russian Revolution. They explore the development of the Soviet Union and the leadership of Lenin and Stalin, analysing evidence to explore the totalitarian elements of their regimes.
