Year 13



Overview

A-level Art and Design (Photography) in Year 13 focuses on developing practical skills and critical understanding through a sustained personal investigation and an externally set assignment. Students will explore a range of photographic media, techniques, and processes, both traditional and digital, while also engaging with historical and contemporary examples of photographic art. The course emphasizes the importance of process, alongside the final outcome, and encourages students to develop their own unique artistic voice.

Externally Set Assignment (ESA):

Students respond to a specific question paper provided by the exam board, choosing one of eight starting points. This assignment includes preparatory work, and a 15-hour supervised exam, where they develop and realize their chosen concept under controlled conditions.

Personal Investigation:

Essay 100-3000 words

This is a sustained, in-depth project chosen by the student, exploring an idea, issue, concept, or theme. It includes:

- Practical Investigation: Students conduct research, experiment with techniques, and develop a body of work, often including a photobook and e-portfolio.
- Critical Study Essay: Students write an essay analysing their work, contextualizing it within relevant artistic practices, and demonstrating critical understanding.

Students are expected to engage with a wide range of photographic techniques, digital manipulation, and various printing methods. The course encourages students to develop their own unique artistic style and to express their individual perspectives through their photography.

Assessment

Assessment Objectives:

AO1: Develop Ideas:

Students explore and experiment with techniques, materials, and processes, informed by their research.

AO2: Experiment and Refine:

Students refine their ideas, making informed choices about media, techniques, and presentation.

AO3: Record Ideas and Reflections:

Students document their research, experimentation, and critical reflections in sketchbooks or journals.

AO4: Present a Personal and Meaningful Response:

Students realise their intentions through a final outcome or series of outcomes, making connections between visual and other elements.

Externally Set Assignment:

Students respond to a specific question paper provided by AQA, choosing one of eight starting points. This assignment includes preparatory work, and a 15-hour supervised exam, where they develop and realize their chosen concept under controlled conditions.

Students are encouraged to research and analyse the work of other photographers and artists, both historical and contemporary, to inform their own practice. Students are expected to manage their time effectively, juggling the demands of both the personal investigation and the externally set assignment.
