Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

I am writing to confirm the arrangements for the **Year 13 Autumn Term Assessments**.

The Year 13 Autumn Assessments play a vital role in supporting students' progress and future plans. They provide an early opportunity to measure how well students have retained and built upon their Year 12 learning, helping teachers identify strengths and areas for improvement. Importantly, they help students develop exam technique and focus their revision strategies, while enabling staff to plan targeted support where needed. By taking these assessments seriously, students lay strong foundations for success in their final year.

The first set of assessments will be held between **Monday 24 November – Wednesday 3 December 2025**. For the larger cohorts taking Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Psychology these will be spread over two classrooms, as per the students individual timetable. The remaining subjects will be in their normal classrooms where a timetable has been provided to help students prepare.

The assessments also provide an essential opportunity for students to familiarise themselves with the format and content of A-Level examination papers. Students who have access arrangements (e.g. extra time, use of a laptop.) for external examinations will have the same arrangements in these assessments.

During the assessment period, students will not be allowed to take study leave. This means that they must attend school as normal so they can access their lessons and be best prepared for their studies.

Mobile phones, iPods and watches are NOT allowed in assessments under any circumstances. Students must be silent in the assessment room, face the front when seated and must not communicate with other students in any way. They should supply all of their own equipment (black pens, pencils, calculators etc.) and bring it to the assessment in a clear plastic bag or pencil case.
